

PARTICIPATION IN SPORT

House Sport is an important and compulsory part of Dimboola Memorial Secondary College's curriculum. All students are expected to participate, either as a competitor or by assisting the school with officiating at the sporting event, or supporting their house officials.

All students are expected to participate in House swimming, athletics and cross-country competitions.

A note from parents in the student's diary must be shown to the Sports Coordinators if the student has a legitimate reason for not being able to participate in any of these compulsory events.

A student who has not competed in the relevant house competition cannot expect to represent the school in that sporting activity.

Students who do not participate in the House sporting events, cannot expect to represent the school in further inter-school sporting activities such as football, hockey, netball, rowing, shooting, golf, etc.

The Sports coordinator/s have the right to make the final decision regarding the participation of any student at the inter-school level.

STUDENTS AND MOBILE PHONES AT SCHOOL

D.M.S.C. discourages students from having mobile phones at school. Should parents require or see fit to allow their children to have mobile phones at school, the following rules will apply:

- The College will accept no responsibility for any loss, theft, damage or unauthorised use of a student's mobile phone.
- The College will accept no responsibility for any calls (authorised or unauthorised) made from a mobile phone whilst at school. This includes the cost of any calls.
- Mobile phones are to be turned off during class time, including any private study period. Students are responsible for ensuring the security of their mobile phone.
- Students are only permitted to use a mobile phone at school before school, at recess and lunch times, and after school.
- Mobile phones which are used inappropriately will be confiscated and returned to the student at the end of the day.
